Every year thousands of frightened, injured and lost animals are treated, cared for and rescued by our SPCA. These animals are sheltered and protected by our caring staff

that does everything in their power to ensure that the best interests of these animals come first and foremost.

Every year we improve our facilities so that we not only provide shelter but that each animal is comfortable and most importantly, feels safe. Currently, we have a new puppy shelter under construction which, which has been a dream of ours for a number of years now and should be complete by the end of August/September. This facility will provide clean, sterile, warm and spacious facilities for the "babies" that come into our care.

We also have plans to upgrade our clinic facilities and provide extra exercise areas for the animals in kennels. These projects could not come to fruition without your support.

In addition to the above we are proud to report that our outreach clinics continue to reach out to hundreds of animals in the poverty stricken areas each year. Last week we hosted a clinic in Marianridge where 179 animals were sterilised, 64 unwanted animals were signed over to us, 21 investigations were opened and 2 dogs were confiscated.

Our SPCA has extremely high standards and we are always thinking of ways we can do better and would welcome any advice or ideas you may have.

We trust that you will continue to support our SPCA.
